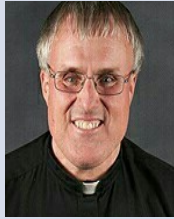

## Dear St. Peter and St. Casimir Family

Every time we pray the general intercessions at mass, one of the prayers that is mentioned is a prayer for the sick. Each year on February 11, the feast of our Lady of Lourdes, holy mother Church sets aside a day to pray for the sick. This day is often called The World Day of the Sick. On this day, we pray in a special way for our brothers and sisters in need of God's healing.

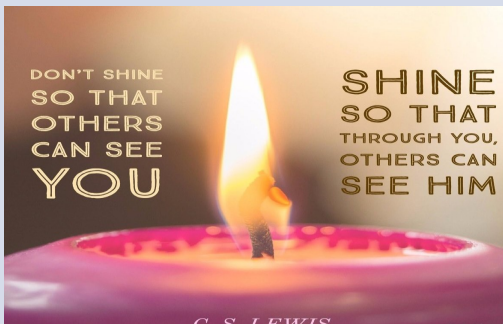


On Saturday, February 11 we will gather at St. Peter's Catholic Church for our communal anointing mass. The mass will begin at 10:30 AM. Anyone who wishes to be anointed can just show up. There is no need to preregister for this mass. This will be a wonderful time for us to come together as a community to pray for everyone in need of healing. The sacrament of the anointing of the sick brings physical as well as spiritual healing. Following the Mass, a lunch will be served. Please come and join us as we pray together for all of our sick brothers and sisters.

This weekend God is calling us to be the light of the world and the salt of the earth. What is it that it times can cause the salt to go flat? I would like to suggest that sin can cause us not to be the salt and light God wants us to be. This is why it is important for us to receive the other healing sacrament that the church offers to us. The sacrament of reconciliation heals us from what I would consider to be the greatest pandemic we have. The pandemic I am talking about is that of sin. Sin can cause us to not be the light that God wants us to be. If we let it, sin, can keep us in darkness and error. What God wants us to do is to walk as children of the light. God does not want us to stay in the dark, but he wants us to come to the light. That light that God wants us to come to is the light of truth, peace, love, joy, and unity. God is the source of unity, light, and peace. God is the one who gives us the necessary strength to continue pressing forward on our journey of faith. 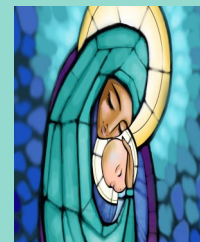

## Eucharistic Revival

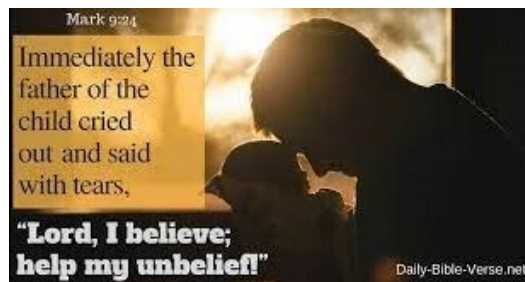
### A Minute with Jesus:

When the old ways aren't working, the Retrouvaille Program helps couples restore & rebuild their marriages.



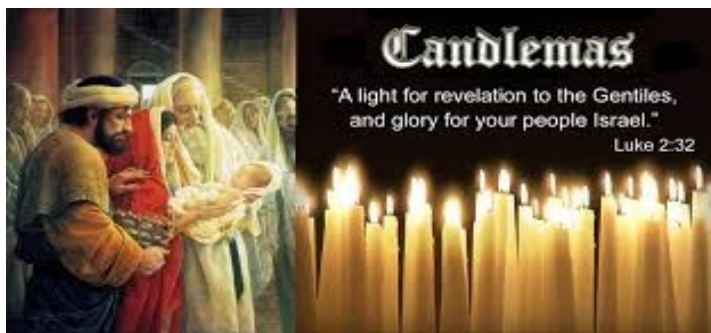
This is a 3-phase program that begins with a weekend stay in the Wausau area.

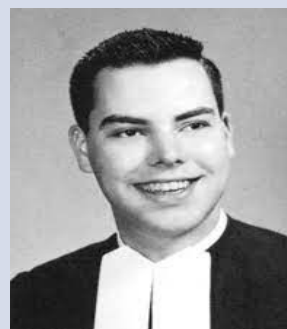

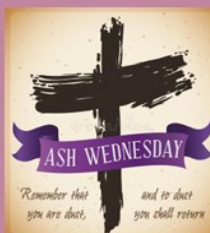

## DIOCESE OF LA CROSSE GUIDELINES for REPORTING INSTANCES OF CHILD ABUSE

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its policies and procedures, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer).

Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Teresa Brown, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Brown at 608.791.0179 or [intakeagent@diolc.org](mailto:intakeagent@diolc.org).

The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: [diolc.org/safe-environment/reporting](http://diolc.org/safe-environment/reporting).

Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities. Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local Parish and on the diocesan website.
